### Challenges:


- January started with another month of Covid-19 closures

### Collections:

Over 150 artifacts and 300 archival documents were donated in 2022 including:

- A large collection representing the Kettleby Post Office/General Store
- Textiles made in King Township
- A rocking chair original to a Schomberg hotel
- Thousands of archaeological fragments
- Cairns family photos and documents (Eversley)

### Grants & Fundraising:

 \$75,000 raised through the King Township Mayor's Cultural Gala for the KHCC, Arts Society King and the King Township Historical Society


# King Heritage & Cultural Centre Master Plan Update:

Adopted by Council in 2021, the Heritage & Cultural Master Plan is the the guiding document for the KHCC for the next 10 years, with a 5 year review. The plan includes 42 action items that will be accomplished from 2021-2031.

#### Actions Completed/ On-going 2022:

- 1.3 Create a schedule of 'popup' exhibits throughout the Township in order to 'meet people where they are at.'
- 1.4 Create a travelling exhibition.
- 1.7 Look for new partnership opportunities for exhibits.
- 3.2 Look for new partnership opportunities for programs and events.
- 3.5 Participate in outreach opportunities.
- 3.6 Act as a community hub by being a location to host regular group and club meetings on site.
- 3.7 Act in an advisory capacity to assist Art Society King and King Township Historical.
  Society in creating heritage and cultural based programming.
- 3.9 Actively pursue partnerships for all KHCC events and programs.
